Working under the direction of the SENCO and the SEN Lead Teacher you will play an integral role in the school's delivery of the graduated pathway including writing My Plans and My Plans+, contributing to Pupil Passports and EHC applications. You will work with KS3 and KS4 staff and students across the school including our sites in Stroud and Cheltenham, although your base will be at Russet House in Gloucester.

The ideal candidate will have significant experience of supporting SEND students and have good knowledge of the SEND Code of Practice. They will be committed to working in a collaborative way to ensure the best outcomes for young people, who have struggled in mainstream settings. The work you do will be crucial in supporting their successful transition back to mainstream. In addition, they will be child-centred in their approach, enthusiastic and hardworking, determined that every day provides a 'fresh start' for children. The successful applicants will benefit from a generous Employee Assistance Programme with a range of benefits including a GP helpline and fitness/health and wellbeing support. With a growing staff body there are plenty of opportunities for collaboration and professional growth. Requests for flexible working would be considered.
